A new online interactive snowmobile trail map and a downloadable GPS background map are now available from the DNR to help people explore and navigate Minnesota's extensive snowmobile trail system. Check out the site at: <http://www.dnr.state.mn.us/snowr>

The online snowmobile trail map, developed by the DNR's Division of Parks and Trails, displays all the DNR and Grant-in-Aid trails across the state. The map makes it easy to zoom, search, pan, and get more information about more than 22,000 miles of snowmobile trails at the click of a mouse. The map also includes a print function so custom maps can be printed at home.

The downloadable GPS background maps are compatible with Garmin GPS units. The maps are available for free on the website and will help snowmobilers navigate trails with their handheld GPS units.

Minnesota was recently named "Best Trails State" in the country by American Trails for facilitating an outstanding statewide system of trails. The Grant-in-Aid snowmobile trail system consists of more than 21,000 miles of snowmobile trails maintained by local club volunteers, and the DNR maintains another 1,000 miles on state trails and in state parks.

2011 is Civil War Sesquicentennial

Trust there will be a lot of attention in 2011 to the Civil War Sesquicentennial, the 150th anniversary of the start of the American Civil War. The Knife River Rec Council will kick off one of the earliest observances in Lake County with its January Community Interest Program. The program

will feature the life of an infantryman in the 1st Minnesota Volunteers, and the heroism of the Minnesotans at Gettysburg. Their actions on the second and third days of the battle in 1863 may have saved the day, and the war, for the Union.

Paul von Goertz, a member of today's 1st Minnesota Volunteers and Civil War re-enactor, will present the program which will feature authentic Civil War infantry uniform and weapons, and the slide show "1st Minn. Vols. - Heroes at Gettysburg."

The program will be held Wednesday, January 19, from 7 to 9 PM at the Knife River Rec building in Knife River. The program is free to the public and refreshments will be served. Persons attending are encouraged to bring a non-perishable food item for the Lake County Food shelf.

WRITING MENTOR VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

MINNEHAHA ELEMENTARY 3RD GRADES

Become part of a 3rd grade Story Literacy residency at Minnehaha Elementary school this new year.

This exciting project, funded by Arrowhead Regional Arts Council and Northland Foundation, will use oral storytelling activities and creative drama to help third graders develop conceptual and organizational skills that can strengthen their writing.

Storyteller Rachel Nelson begins her 12-week Story Literacy residency at Minnehaha Elementary on January 10. After a similar residency there last year, the third grade teachers asked her back-with a new idea: adding **volunteer writing mentors** to give these emergent writers small-group mentoring as they transfer their stories onto the page.

Volunteers would come for 1 ½ hours each Thursday afternoon to lead small groups of emerging writers in a 55-minute feedback and story development session. After each weekly session, volunteers would stay for a 25-minute debriefing session with trainer/supervisor Linda Melcher. At the end of this residency, each third grader will write, illustrate, and publish one story book.

Volunteer benefits include: free training sessions and supervision with Linda Melcher, PhD in Education; support debriefings with Linda and other volunteer mentors after each class session; discovering how storytelling and creative drama can enliven writing; and partial travel reimbursement (gas or bus) from Arrowhead RSVP. Folks interested in writing, storytelling, creative drama, and/or education would find this volunteer job rewarding.

Time commitment: 1 ½ hours, Thursday afternoons for 10 weeks, plus 1-2 trainings to be scheduled. Interested volunteers may contact:

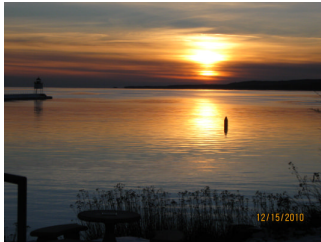
